As Part of a Lesson

INTRODUCE A LESSON

Teachers can use a Walkabout or a 180 as an ignite, a hook, or an anticipatory set.

CHECK FOR UNDERSTANDING

Some teachers use the platform to check for understanding after they have taught a lesson but before testing students on the content.

REVIEW

Some teachers use a Walkabout or a 180 at the end of a lesson or unit to review content that was previously taught.

Walkabouts and 180s are great for reviewing content before a test or a quiz.

FORMATIVE ASSESSMENT

Teachers should upload students into the Walkabouts Platform to utilize this tool.

With the assessment tab open, teachers can take notes on students while they complete a lesson.







Group Work

WHOLE GROUP

Teachers can play a Walkabout or a 180 during full group instruction to get students moving before small group or independent work.

SMALL GROUPS

The platform works on any device, so it is easy to use for small group work. Teachers can create playlists to use with small groups to support each group in their learning.

INDEPENDENT WORK

Teachers can assign Walkabouts or 180s to students to use as independent work. Students can view assignments as soon as they log in to the Walkabouts platform.

Movement Breaks

The Walkabouts Platform is the best option for content-based classroom movement breaks, including indoor recess!

- Walkabouts and 180s were designed with brain research in mind to help students move while they learn. Many teachers note that students are more focused and less distracted after completing a lesson.
- Moves, short movement break videos, are perfect for brain breaks.
